"... that you may become mature Christians and may fulfill God's will for you." Col. 4:12b (Ph)

WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO PUT SOMETHING INTO PRACTICE?

OUR FOCUS:

We will focus on the **Four Basic Habits** every Christian needs to develop in order to grow to spiritual maturity. We will:

- Equip you with the skills you need to begin these habits
- Explain the tools you need to continue these habits.

WHAT IS "SPIRITUAL MATURITY"?

"...In the unity of common faith, and knowledge of the Son of God, we arrive at real maturity - the measure of development which is meant by 'the fullness of Christ."

Eph 4:13(Ph)

Spiritual Maturity is being like Christ.

"For from the very beginning God decided that those who came to him ... should become like his Son..."

Rom.8:29(LB)

FACTS ABOUT SPIRITUAL MATURITY

1. IT'S NOT AUTOMATIC

"You have been Christians for a long time now, and you ought to be teaching others, but instead ... you need someone to teach you ... When a person is still living on milk, it shows he isn't very far along in the Christian life ... He's still a baby Christian!"

Heb. 5:12-13 (LB)

2. IT IS A PROCESS

"Learn to be mature." Prov. 8:5 (GN)

"Continue to grow in the grace and knowledge of our savior Jesus Christ." 2 Peter 3:18 (GN)

3. IT TAKES DISCIPLINE

- "Take the time and the trouble to keep yourself spiritually fit." 1Tim. 4:7b (Ph)
- "Discipline yourself for the purpose of godliness."

The objective of your Quiet Time is not to study about Christ, but to actually spend time with him.

UNDERSTANDING DISCIPLESHIP

- 1. Mature believers are called disciples.
- 2. I cannot be a disciple without being disciplined.
- 3. The more disciplined I become the more God can use me.
- 4. The mark of a disciple is cross bearing.

FOUR HABITS OF A DISCIPLE

HOW CAN I BECOME A DISCIPLE? Develop DISCIPLINE HABITS

"... You have **put off the old self** with its **HABITS**, and have put on the new self ... which God is continually renewing in his own image, to bring you to a full knowledge of himself." Col. 3:9-10

1. TIME WITH GOD'S WORD

"If you **continue in my Word**, then you are my disciples indeed. And you will know the truth and the truth will set you free."

John 8:31-32

2. PRAYER

"If you remain in me, and my words remain in you, then you will **ask for anything you wish**, and you shall have it ... in this way you become my disciples."

John 15:7-8 (GN)

3. GIVING

"None of you can be my disciple unless **he gives up all of his possessions.**" Luke 14:33 (JB)

"The purpose of tithing is to teach you to always **put God first** in your lives." Deut. 14:23 (LB)

4. FELLOWSHIP

"Love each other just as much as I love you. Your **strong love for each other** will prove to the world that you are my disciples."

John 13:34-35 (LB)

START AND MAINTAIN GOOD HABITS

STEP ONE: DESIRE

You must start with a strong desire. You must be internally motivated. External motivations don't last. If you start only half-heartedly, you will never make it to the success point.

STEP TWO: DECIDE

Begin right now! Don't wait. Don't procrastinate. You don't slide into a new habit. "One of these days" never arrives. You must have a starting point. It's easier to break a bad habit today than it will be tomorrow! "If you wait for perfect conditions, you will never get anything done." Eccl. 11:4 (LB)

STEP THREE: DECLARATION

Announce your intentions publicly. Make a covenant or resolution. The power of a vow is awesome. It is particularly powerful if you put your commitment in writing. "Make vows to the Lord your God and fulfill them."

Ps. 76:11

STEP FOUR: DETERMINATION

Never allow an exception until the new habit is securely rooted in your life. Each lapse will be fatal. A single slip unwinds many turns at first. Continuity and success at the start is essential. Never be swayed by "just this once". The act of yielding weakens the will and reinforces your lack of self-control. It takes 3 weeks to become comfortable with a new habit and it takes another 3 to 4 weeks (doing it daily) for it to become a part of your life.

IT TAKES 7 TO 21 REPETITIONS TO LEARN SOMETHING!

STEP FIVE: DO IT

Whenever you feel the slightest urge or prompting to practice this new habit - DO IT THEN! Don't wait. Seize every opportunity to reinforce your habit. Those feelings will not last, so whenever you feel inclined to perform your new habit, do so!

STEP SIX: DOUBLE UP

Get a partner who will support you and encourage you. Find someone who is willing to hold you accountable and check up on you especially in the early days before the habit is firmly rooted in your life.

"Let us consider and give attentive, continuous care to watching over each other, studying how we may stir up and stimulate each other to ... helpful deeds and noble activities."

STEP SEVEN: DEPEND ON GOD

Rely on God's power to help you establish the habit. Remember, Satan does not want you to develop habits that help you grow spiritually and make you like Christ so he will do all he can to tempt you, cause you to slip, or discourage you. Pray!

THE HABIT OF A DAILY TIME WITH GOD

HOW TO HAVE A QUIET TIME

DEFINITION: "A quiet time is a daily time I set aside to be alone with God to get to know Him through the Bible and prayer."

I. THE IMPORTANCE OF A DAILY QUIET TIME

Your time alone with God should be the top priority in your schedule for five reasons:

THE PURPOSE OF A DAILY QUIET TIME

1. TO GIVE DEVOTION

"Give to the Lord the glory due to his name. Worship the Lord in the splendor of his holiness." Ps. 29:2

"(Hezekiah) was successful, because everything he did ... he did in **a spirit of complete devotion** to his God."

HOW TO BEGIN A DAILY QUIET TIME

1. SELECT A SPECIFIC TIME.

Whatever time you set, be consistent.

The best time to have a quiet time is when I am at my best!!

We recommend the morning.

Reasons for considering an early morning quiet time:

1. The example of Bible character.

(Abraham, Jacob, Moses, Hannah, Job, Hezekiah, David, Daniel, Jesus.)

- 2. It seems logical to begin the day with it.
 - "The best time to tune your instrument is before you play the concert, not after!"
- 3. It demonstrates that meeting with God is your first priority. You give him the first part of your day!
- 4. You are likely to be more rested, your mind is less cluttered, and it's often the quietist time!

HOW LONG SHOULD A QUIET TIME BE:

3 Guidelines

- O Start with 15 minutes and let it grow.
- Don't watch the clock!
- Emphasize quality, not quantity!

2. CHOOSE A SPECIAL PLACE.

"Jesus left the city and went, as he usually did, to the Mount of Olives ... to pray." Luke 22:39 (GN)

The Important Factor:

"Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went to a **solitary place**, where he prayed."

Mark 1:35

3. GATHER THE RESOURCES YOU'LL NEED.

- 1. A Bible with readable print.
- 2. A Notebook to write down what the Lord speaks to you about, and to keep your prayer list.
- 3. A Songbook if you want to sing.

4. BEGIN WITH THE RIGHT ATTITUDES

"Be still, and know that I am God." Ps. 46:10

EXPECTENCY

"Open my eyes to see wonderful things in your Word." Ps. 119:18 (LB)

5. FOLLOW A SIMPLE PLAN: See Appendix A - "FIFTEEN MINUTES WITH GOD"

II. HOW TO OVERCOME THE PROBLEMS WITH YOUR QUIET TIME

1. THE PROBLEM OF DISCIPLINE

Your first problem in establishing a quiet time will face you the moment you wake each morning: Am I going to get out of bed? ("The Battle of the Blankets")

Suggestions

- 1. Go to bed on time.
- 2. Get up immediately.
- 3. Be aware of quiet time robbers.
- 4. Fall asleep thinking spiritual thoughts.

2. THE PROBLEM OF DISTRACTIONS

Satan will try to use anything to get your mind to wander during a quiet time.

Suggestions

- 1. Get out of bed.
- 2. Get thoroughly awake.
- 3. Read and pray aloud.
- 4. Walk during your prayer time.
- 5. Keep a journal.

3. THE PROBLEM OF DRYNESS

Sometimes you will feel like you're not getting anything out of your quiet time. ("The Battle of the Blahs")

[&]quot;The thing you should want most is God's kingdom and doing what God wants" Mat 6:33 (NCV)

Never judge your quiet time by your feelings.

Possible Causes of Spiritual Dryness

- 1. Your physical condition.
- 2. Disobedience to God.
- 3. Rushing your quiet time.
- 4. Getting in a rut.
- 5. Not sharing insights with others.

4. THE PROBLEM OF DILIGENCE

Your greatest problem will be your struggle to stay consistent. I find Satan fights nothing harder than my quiet time.

Suggestions

- 1. Make a covenant or vow to God.
- 2. Schedule it on your daily calendar.
- 3. Be prepared for Satan's excuses.
- 4. Leave your Bible open at night to the passage for the next day!

What if I miss a day?

- Don't become guilty
- Don't become legalistic.
- Don't give up

It takes <u>Three</u> weeks for you to become familiar with a new task. Then it takes another <u>Three</u> weeks before it becomes a comfortable habit.

HOW TO PRAISE GOD:

1st: As you read your Bible, make a list of God's character qualities that you discover and then review them when you pray. (See Prayer Guide 1)

Examples:

God is patient Num. 14:18 God is merciful Num. 14:18 God is forgiving Num. 14.18
God knows everything 1 Sam. 2:2
God is loving 1 John 4:8

KEY: God's Character is the basis for our boldness in making requests in prayer. God answers the prayers that acknowledge who he is!

2nd: Remind yourself and affirm the promises God has made that are contained in the meaning of his names. (See *Prayer Guide 2*)

<u>3rd:</u> Make a list of all that you are thankful for and review them when you pray. (See Prayer Guide 3)

2. PURPOSE: I COMMIT MYSELF TO GOD'S PURPOSE AND WILL FOR MY LIFE

B. What Fasting Is NOT...

Fasting is not the act of refraining from things _____ than food. i.e. social media, TV, etc.

While it is a good thing to give some of these things up in favor of giving that time and attention to the Lord, this act is called a _____.

The practice of fasting is not limited to pastors or specific times of the year. Kinds of fasts

There are two kinds of fasts:

- ____
- •

A _____ fast is a fast that is done privately by an individual or group when prompted to do so by an extraordinary need or an overwhelming burden to get closer to God.

A _____ fast is a fast which is proclaimed by a leader for an entire group of people at a specific time or due to unusual circumstances.

Bethlehem Assembly practices called fasts at the beginning of each year but also emphasizes the need for private fasts throughout one's Christian walk.

C. Before You Fast...

In Franklin Jentzen's Fasting Journal he writes that there are three things you must ask yourself before you fast:

- 1. What are the motives behind the fast?
- 2. What are the specific things I am fasting for?
- 3. Am I determined to minister to the Lord during my fast?

While there are many health benefits that can be ascribed to fasting such as detoxing and weight loss, if these alone are the motives, you are not fasting – you're just hungry!

The primary motive (reason) for deciding to fast should be internal – spiritual growth: one's desire to feed the spirit and deny the flesh – in short, to be more like God and less like you!

Sometimes, however, the fast is provoked by a dire set of circumstances which one cannot confront without the boldness of the Holy Spirit; therefore, the motives are <u>external</u>: action is provoked by circumstances. In this case the end goal is to be able to confront and overcome those circumstances according to God's will –

which means that we need to become more like God to discern His will.

1. What are the specific set of needs I am fasting for?

Whether your motives are internal (spiritual growth) or external (provoked by circumstances) you should be able to clearly define and/or list the specific set of needs you are fasting for and keep them in the center of your prayers and forefront of your mind throughout your fast.

2. Am I determined to minister to the Lord during my fast?

Fasting shouldn't be all about you. It's not about "persuading" God to do something for you just because you skipped a meal or two. Fasting is about recognizing that I can't get to something or through something without God's help – therefore God is sovereign and worthy of praise. We should be worshipping God because he can do what I need, whether he chooses to or not.

D. Types of Fasts

While there are many names for particular fasts, in actuality there are only two types of fasts:

- ____ Fast
- _____ Fast

A full fast is to abstain from all food and liquid for a set period of time.

A partial fast is to abstain from certain types of foods and/or liquids for a set period of time. i.e. water fast; Daniel fast.

Again, abstaining from your cell phone, or social media, or TV is NOT fasting, though it might still be a good idea!

E. How to Fast...

*If you are on medication, see your doctor before beginning any long term fasting

- a) 1 Meal fast any meal during your day
- b) Morning Fast fast in the morning from 6:00 am to 12:00 pm (full fast or partial fast with liquids).
- c) Half Day Fast fast from 6:00 am to 6:00 pm (full fast or partial fast with liquids)
- d) Full day Fast a complete 24-hour period (i.e. 6:00 pm to 6:00 pm the following day- full fast or partial fast with liquids)
- e) Three-day Fast (aka Esther fast) a complete 72-hour period (full fast or partial fast with liquids)
- f) 21 Day Fast (aka Daniel fast) a daily partial fast for 21 consecutive days
- g) 30 Days or more (incorporating a, b, or c)

If you have never fasted before, start with (a) and gradually build up your strength to (b) and beyond.

F. While I Fast...

I pray at the beginning of my fast, making my specific vow, and declaring my needs.

I should be in continual prayer – in constant communication with God.

I should be reading the Bible.

I should be intentional about exposing myself to other resources which will add to my spiritual growth i.e. books, listening to worship, watching sermons, watching a Christian movie.

When the time has been completed, I should pray again surrendering my fast – thanking God for helping me through the fast and thanking God for any new revelation before I eat.

Questions...

What if I forget or if I am unable to maintain my fast?

Pray – at that moment pray and surrender your fast asking God to help you to do it better the next time. Also, consider your vow – maybe you weren't yet ready for (c) – go back to (b) next time.

Can I fast at school or at work?

Absolutely! You can fast anywhere, anytime but you should be prepared for the spiritual warfare that comes in the form of distractions, conflicts, and temptations.

The devil does NOT want you to fast. He will scheme against you so expect the unexpected, such as:

- People offering to take you to lunch.
- Free food at the office.
- The person in the next cubicle/office eating something that smells soooooo delicious!
- Persons of the opposite sex distracting you.
- People cutting you off in traffic.
- People seemingly trying to provoke you into an argument or even a physical altercation.
- Pressure at work which makes you crave that cup of coffee.
- Etc.

Other questions about specific foods/liquids to eat or avoid -

Don't become legalistic. Make your vow and honor it, whatever that vows may be.

Summary

- Fasting is a discipline that every Christian should develop, not just pastors and leaders.
- My motives should be centered on God, not on me.
- There are different ways to fast, but fasting always involves giving up food.
- I should be in constant communication with God while I fast worshipping him in prayer.

SPIRITUAL WARFARE

2 Corinthians 10:3-5 English Standard Version (ESV)

I. SPIRITUAL _____

1. We are involved in a Spiritual War each moment of each day of our lives. It is a war that we cannot see with our physical eyes full of battles that cannot be won with our physical bodies.

These battles happen

- At work
- At school
- At home
- Everywhere

The war is for peoples' souls. It started thousands of years ago when the devil forfeited his heavenly position.

Isaiah 14:12-15 English Standard Version (ESV)

¹² "How you are fallen from heaven, O Day Star, son of Dawn! How you are cut down to the ground, you who laid the nations low! ¹³ You said in your heart, 'I will ascend to heaven; above the stars of God. I will set my throne on high; I will sit on the mount of assembly in the far reaches of the north; ¹⁴ I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will make myself like the Most High. ¹⁵ But you are brought down to Sheol, to the far reaches of the pit.

- 2. The devil has been warring against God's people since the Garden of Eden; therefore, he is an expert on manipulating people and situations in order to get the believer's focus off of God and on to self.

The conflict which we perceive in our lives (physical, social, professional, etc.) is a byproduct of the attack on our Spirits. We ARE in Spiritual Warfare. Once we accept this truth, we can adjust our methods of warfare by employing the weapons (armor) provided by God. As long as we refuse to accept this truth, we will be vulnerable to struggle with forgiveness not being able to forgive others or accept forgiveness for ourselves.

Malachi 3:10 (NIV) WHAT BAOG TEACHES ABOUT GIVING 1. BAOG requires members and encourages regular attenders to support the church through the giving of Tithes and Offerings. Question - Why should I give? God is a giving God; he gave us life, He gave us purpose, and He gave us His only begotten son, Jesus Christ. Christians should give because giving makes us like God. Question - If Tithes are an Old Testament principle, why does Bethlehem receive them?

The New Testament instruction to the Church at Corinth to "set aside a sum of money in keeping with your income" represents a specific percentage of income as a minimum requirement for giving. This instruction is consistent and in harmony with the Old Testament principle of the various tithes, and, as we believe the entirety of the scriptures to be the inspired word of God, we accept the tithe (10%) as a standard for the minimum obligation of the believer.

Question - What's the difference between "Tithes" and "Offerings"?

Tithes are the minimum obligation of the believer to support the ministry. Offerings represent giving above and beyond the tithes. BOTH ARE FREE-WILL GIVING.

Question - How often should I give?

According to the instruction to the Church at Corinth, Christians should give "On the first day of every week." (1 Corinthians 16:2)

What substitute for God did you use to find meaning in your life? (sports/fitness, success at work, marriage, sex, making money, drugs/alcohol, having fun, entertainment, popularity, hobbies)

2. HOW I REALIZED I NEEDED CHRIST.

What significant steps led up to your conversion?

What needs, hurts, or problems made you dissatisfied with the way you were living without God?

How did God get your attention? What motivated you?

3. HOW I COMMITTED MY LIFE TO CHRIST.

What specifically did you do? Where did it happen? What did you say in your prayer? Be specific.

4. THE DIFFERENCE IT HAS MADE IN MY LIFE.

What benefits have you experienced or felt?
What problems have been resolved?
How has Jesus helped you change for the better?
How has it helped your relationships? Give a current example.

B. IF YOU BECAME A CHRISTIAN ______ BUT WALKED AWAY OR NEVER GREW UNTIL A DEEPER RECOMMITMENT AS AN ADULT.


Use the same four steps, but start with the time just prior to your recommitment. Give some examples of how you were trying to meet your own needs without Christ but it wasn't working. Describe what caused you to realize you needed Christ directing your life and how you made a full commitment to him. Then explain how Jesus is currently meeting the deepest needs in your life.

C. IF YOU BECAME A CHRISTIAN AT AN EARLY AGE AND NEVER STRAYED.

Use the same four steps with this modification: Point out some deep need or common problem that you see other people trying to resolve. Point out how unsuccessful their attempts are to meet their own need. Then

explain why you never experienced that problem by trusting Christ early in life. Don't say the exact age. Continue with steps 3 and 4.

HOW TO LEAD INTO YOUR TESTIMONY

1. Listen for problems or needs that Jesus has helped you with.

"You know, that used to be a big issue in my life too (or my marriage, etc.). In fact, I felt pretty (hopeless, frustrated, etc.) But then I discovered something that made a major difference in my life."

2. Refer to something in the news or on TV that deals with a common need or problem.

"Did you read about... I can sure identify with how those people feel. It wasn't that long ago that I struggled with that too. But then something happened that changed everything for me..."

Start with a statement they'd agree with or situation they relate to.

- "It seems like life is getting faster and faster."
- "Sometimes life just gets so complicated."
- "Life doesn't always turn out the way you planned it."

3. Apologize to people you've known a long time but haven't witnessed to.

"Bill, I need to apologize to you. We've known each other a long time, and I consider you to be a good friend. But friends don't keep secrets – and I've never told you about the best thing that ever happened to me. I guess I was afraid you'd think I was some kind of nut. Anyway... (begin your story)."

II. COMMUNICATION TIPS: HOW TO SHARE EFFECTIVELY

1. RECOGNIZE YOUR PERSONAL STYLE OF WITNESSING



This is called "Receptivity." How open are they to the Good News?

It is important to realize that people go through a process in coming to faith in Christ and they must be approached differently depending on where they are.

Examples of levels of spiritual receptivity

"Listen to me, you stubborn-hearted, you who are far from righteousness." Isa. 46:12 (NIV)

(Jesus with an unbeliever) "Realizing this man's understanding, Jesus said to him, 'You are not far from the Kingdom of God.'"

Mark 12:34(LB)

"He has brought this Good News of peace to you <u>Gentiles who were very far away</u> from him, and to us Jews who were near." Eph. 2:17 (LB)

"Now you belong to Christ Jesus. Though you once were far away from God, now you have been brought near to him because of the blood of Christ." Eph. 2:13 (NLT)

Facts:

- People often require multiple exposures at each stage before moving on.
- A person can get stuck at any stage. The #1 reason is **FEAR**.
- Every stage requires a different response by me!

Begin reading where you left off the day before. Read until you feel God has told you something. Then stop and think about it.

3. REFLECT ON A VERSE.

Think about what the passage means to your life. Write down your thoughts. Part of reflecting is *memorizing* verses that speak to you in a special way.

4. RECORD WHAT GOD DID.

Write out a personal application statement that is practical, passable, and measurable.

"Thoughts disentangle themselves when they pass through the lips and the fingertips."

5. REQUEST.

Conclude your Quiet Time by talking to God.

Appendix I: SUGGESTIONS FOR PREPARING YOUR TESTIMONY

- Pray and ask God to give you the right words.
- Write it out on paper. God honors preparation.
- Keep it short and to the point. Don't lose site of your goal.
- Be succinct. Avoid excessive, unnecessary details.
- Try to keep your testimony below 3 minutes.
- Refer to experiences most people have in common.
- Share a slice of your life (a story) that they will identify with.
- Be honest about your continuing struggles. Your life is not perfect.
- Don't imply that all of your problems ended at conversion.
- Spend the most time on part 4: the difference Christ has made.
- Emphasize WHY you received Christ (the benefits of doing it).
- Mention the benefit of being certain of your destiny when you die.
- Don't exaggerate or brag about pre-conversion sins.
- Don't make negative remarks about other religions or people.

- Don't mention any denomination.
- Don't quote a lot of Scripture.
- Don't answer questions they haven't asked.
- Give concrete examples of the changes in your life.
- The more specific you are, the more dynamic it will be.
- Avoid using dates, names, and ages. It doesn't matter to them.
- Be prepared. Practice it until it feels and sounds natural.
- Read it aloud and edit it to make it conversational.
- Let a friend read it and make suggestions.
- Speak casually and informally, in a matter-of-fact tone.
- Don't dramatize or embellish your story.
- Don't share mystical experiences. Share on their level, not yours.
- Don't talk down to people. Don't sound "preachy."
- Use "I, me, and my" not "You". It's about you not them.
- Use humor it reduces tension and relaxes people. Smile!
- Choose a central theme. (See list)



Appendix Q: HOW TO BUILD A BRIDGE OF FRIENDSHIP A plan for sharing your faith

Good friendships are usually intentional, rather than accidental. Developing friendships with unbelievers often requires going the second mile, taking some risks, and moving outside your own comfort zone. And with our busy lifestyles, it takes *planning*. If you don't plan to cultivate friendships with unbelievers, you'll find that you never have the time to do so.

"We should make our plans - counting on God to direct us." Pr. 16:9

STEP #1: BECOME AWARE - of the unbelievers God has placed in your life.

- ✓ Make a list of them by name.
- ✓ Realize that they are your responsibility.
- ✓ Assess each person's level of spiritual receptivity.
- ✓ Discover and write down what their interests and needs are.
- ✓ Look for areas of common ground that you can build on.
- ✓ Figure out what kind of testimony each would respond to.

STEP #2: COMMIT TO PRAYER

- ✓ Use your list to pray daily for your unsaved friends.
- ✓ Pray that God will draw them to himself. John 6:44
- ✓ Pray that God will remove their spiritual blindness. 2 Cor. 4:3-4
- ✓ Pray that the Holy Spirit will make their heart receptive. Jn.16:8-13
- ✓ Pray you'll get the opportunity to share a clear witness. Col.4 3-5
- ✓ Pray that God will give you wisdom in what to say. James 1:5
- ✓ Pray the Holy Spirit will use the words you say. 1 Thess. 1:5

STEP #3: SHOW YOU CARE

✓ Treat everyone with respect as people, not as "prospects".

- ✓ Be a genuine friend. Help them in practical ways.
- ✓ Be a good listener. It is a great way to show love.
- ✓ Make service your aim, not recruitment.
- ✓ Invite them into your home.
- ✓ Consciously focus your concern on meeting their needs.
- ✓ Go out of your way to love them until they ask you why.
- ✓ Accept people as they are without being judgmental.

STEP #4: BE READY TO SHARE

- ✓ Identify yourself as a positive, joyful follower of Christ.
- ✓ Share a testimony when the occasion naturally arises. (It will)
- ✓ Never force the Good News. Be patient. God is working!
- ✓ Use crisis situations to show why we all need God.
- ✓ Ask questions that lead to spiritual discussions.
- ✓ Give them appropriate message tapes or books to read.
- ✓ Concentrate on the essential. Don't get sidetracked by hang-ups.
- ✓ Invite them to a seeker service at church.
- ✓ Offer to lead in a prayer to commit after sharing the Good News.

- 5. Invite a friend to go to a movie with you, and then, over coffee, utilize the movie to discuss their outlook on life.
- 6. Leave a piece of evangelistic literature for a waiter or waitress along with a generous tip!
- 7. Memorize Luke 19:10 and create a list of the potential "lost" people you'd like to reach in your area.
- 8. Invite some people from other cultures into a discussion on the question, "What do you think a Christian is?"
- 9. Make a list of various ethnic and cultural groups you come across in Nassau/Queens
- 10. Memorize John 3:16-18.
- 11. Attend a local cultural or ethnically distinctive event in an effort to understand the cultures around your area.
- 12. Read Matthew 25 and try to identify one project per month that you can do for the types of people Jesus lists.
